ARIZONA

The Arizona sites should be humming along this time of year and banding lots of birds on spring migration, but Harshaw Creek is still the only site banding. It was humming though! 110 birds, lots of recaptures, some older birds, and a few fresh Anna's juveniles thrown into the mix! Fort Huachuca and the Southwestern Research Station were unable to monitor. The George Walker House in Paradise was able to conduct a feeder watch and recorded 6 species, all adults, and spotted some yellow pollen on birds as well.

Session Remarks: There are a lot of birds here! It's a migration day with high abundance for both the number of birds captured and counted. It's a fun day with the recapture rate over 65%. Our older birds this session included two 4, two 5, and a 6-year-old BBLH males (all 5 birds were banded as HY); a 5 and 6 year old BCHU males; a 5 year old ANHU male and two 6 year old ANHU females. Both Anna's and Broad-billed females are gravid. The Surprise for the day were 3 juvenile male Anna's. Their beaks were really short and they were so buffy. It seems they must have been in a nearby nest. We also capture a female Rufous. We often observed Rufous here since the last session; usually just one but sometimes two at a time. We appreciate the help of Mario and his daughter Serenity.
